



**GREEN SQUARE AQUATIC CENTRE + GUNYAMA PARK** 

## MORE THAN JUST A POOL. OR A PARK. IT'S LIKE HAVING YOUR CAKE - AND EATING IT TOO.

Our proposal imagines an aquatic centre in which four key activities identified or implied in the brief - swimming, running, training and spectating - are functionally and physically intertwined. Rather than identifying and separating, we instead imagine the centre as a series of stacked and interleaved buildings and spaces united in the modern day pursuit of fitness and well-being.

A 'fitness loop' running track circles the athletic field, rises up and over the podium of the centre itself, providing access to the gym, entrance to the pools and daycare facilities. This public amenity is open to all, always, linking together the athletic field with the aquatic centre and making it very clear - I AM A PUBLIC BUILDING. Under the podium are reception and lobby spaces, mechanical plant rooms, trigen/cogen facilities expressed

through industrial-scaled brick chimneys reminiscent of Green Square and Zetland's industrial history, car park, offices and back of house facilities.

Opening to the athletic field, the podium transforms into a series of generous steps and landscaped berm, providing spectator seating, or a relaxed lounging spot to watch a movie at night, projected onto the pool hall (a moonlight cinema). The pools themselves are amalgamated, employing varying depths and adjustable barriers to separate as required, to allow an experience of all the pools without leaving the water and provide maximum programmatic flexibility to the centre.

Our proposal strives to break down clear programmatic barriers, to allow a complex set of blurred relationships between pool-field, pool-gym, gym-field, in the commitment to community found in the best of international public buildings.
